

## Fall on Snow, Unable to Self-Arrest, Faulty Use of Crampons--Failed to Put Them On

Oregon, Mt. Hood, South Side Route

On February 4, while ascending the South Side Route, Andy Kim (age unknown) stopped at the 9,500foot elevation to put on his crampons. As he was leveling a platform for the transition, he slipped and slid about 500 feet. He lost his ice axe while attempting self-arrest. Joe Owens, a guide and mountain rescue leader, witnessed the fall and attended to Kim, who had suffered a forehead wound (and broken helmet) and sore limbs. Owens escorted Kim by short rope to a Timberline snowcat for ski patrol evacuation.

## Analysis

Kim delayed donning crampons needed for purchase on the frozen snow surface. These conditions also made self-arrest problematic. (Source: Jeff Scheetz, Portland Mountain Rescue.)
