

## **SLIP ON ROCK WHILE LEADING**

Canada, Québec, Chicoutimi-Nord

This incident occurred on April 24, around 2 p.m., as a female climber, age 27, was leading a dihedral on Post Scriptum (5.11d) in the Marshmallows Sector. The footholds were slippery, and as she held a gaston (a thumb-down grip on side-pull hold) at the level of her right shoulder, a foot slipped and she found herself out of balance with almost all her weight held by the gaston. The result was bursitis of the right shoulder.

## ANALYSIS

Climbing difficult routes can lead to joint injuries. Spring often brings wet conditions and extra care must be taken. Climb cautiously or consider an alternative route. On a sport climb, it is sometimes better to let go and take a safe fall rather than hold on and strain to the point of injury. (Source: Fédération québécoise de la montagne et de l'escalade.
